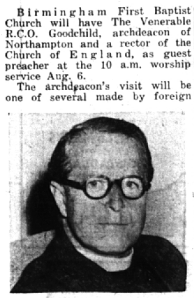


1st Baptist to Host British Archdeacon

Rev. Bigart Joins N. Congregational

The Rev. William D. Bigart, chaplain at Lawrence Institute of Technology in Southfield, will be guest preacher Sunday at North Congregational Church.

Rev. Bigart recently became a member of North Church. He is a member of the National Association of Bible Instructors and the American Association of University Professors.

REV. BIGART served as an army chaplain from 1944 to 1948 and holds the rank of major in the U.S. Army Reserve. He is also a member of the Military Chapter Association.

Formerly a professor of philosophy at Muskingum College, New Concord, Ohio, Rev. Bigart was pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church, Syracuse, N. Y., from 1948 to 1953.

the Royal Air Force. Following his release in 1947, he held the position of Warden of St. Michael's House in Hamburg, Germany, and was responsible for the training and spiritual rehabilitation of ex-Nazi youth leaders, a program sponsored by World and British Councils of Churches.

From 1953 to 1959 Mr. Goodchild served as vicar and rural dean in Sussex, a large country town in Sussex, and was a leader in the Inter-Church Aid and Refugee Service Department of the British Council of Churches.
