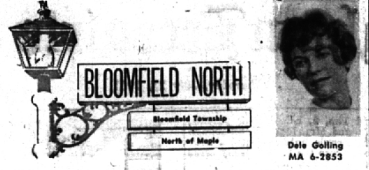


Area Residents Hail Houseguests, Holidays

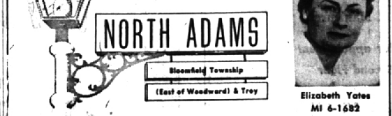

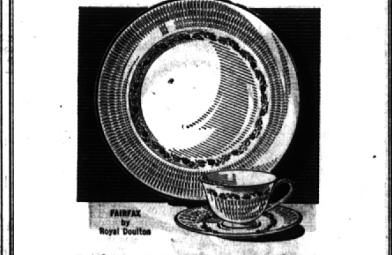
