

Springdale to Get Increased Parking

Springdale Park is going to get more parking spaces. Birmingham city commissioners decided Monday night to construct 14 additional spaces in the park's present lot at an estimated cost of \$1500.

Acting City Manager Robert S. Kenning and Forestry and Parks Supt. Charles Gale requested the addition as a result of increased use of the park's facilities.

COMMISSIONERS also decided to retain a policy of limiting picnic groups to no more than 50 on the park's busy days.

They felt that to increase the number of individuals using the park's facilities as well as the number of groups that could use it at one time.

Vote Out Union At Troy Plant

A slim margin of three votes ousted the International Union of Electrical, Radio and Machine Workers (AFL-CIO) as bargaining agent for employees at Troy's Dynamic Manufacturing, Inc.

The plant's 107 production workers voted 56 to 52 Friday against retaining the union in an election conducted by the National Labor Relations Board.

The National Labor Relations Board ordered the election after half the production workers petitioned the NLRB to decertify the union.

"WE ARE HAPPY about the results," said Personnel Manager Lee Gray, "but it was the man who did the voting. They decided the fate of the union."

"It was a tough one to lose, but the vote will be final," said Robert R. Rock, president of Local 935 at the plant.

The workers' vote will not have any effect on a federal court order instructing the company to abide by an arbitration order awarding about \$50,000 back pay to union members who had been on strike.

ABOUT 180 MEMBERS of the local went on strike in February 1960. Some of the workers remained on the job and the company hired others to replace the strikers.

The strikers returned to work in May and the arbitrator ordered the company to pay the men their retroactive pay. The arbitrator said the firm must pay the difference between what the former strikers received in pay from outside jobs and what they would have received from the company had they been called back immediately.

According to a company spokesman, the firm did not follow the arbitrator's directive because it had been unable to check into the outside pay records of all of the men in question.

Union leaders and company officials will discuss the back pay at a meeting this week.
