### Water Accidents Increase in 1960

Stressing need for increased caution in the peak activity months of June through August, the State Police in their annual compilation have reported that 258 persons died and 224 were injured in 488 water accidents in Michigan during 1960.

The warning was prompted by figures that show the June-August period had 324, or 66 per cent, of all accidents last year and 146, or 30 per cent, of the 248 fatal mishaps.

More than 30 deaths have occurred in the first four and a half months this year, according to the report.

ALTHOUGH LAST year's drownings were 67, or 21 per cent, fewer than in 1959, accidents increased 31, or seven per cent, and there were 45, or 25 per cent, more injured. In 52 fatal accidents there was property damage only.

The 258 drownings included 83 swimmers or waders, 37 boat operators, 30 boat passengers, 13 children who strayed from parents and into water, seven skin or scuba divers, two water skiers, 24 suicides and 62 who died under other circumstances.
