- BONDING PROPOSITION
Shall Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, borrow the sum of not exceeding Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) Dollars and issue its bonds therefor for the purpose of erecting and furnishing a swimming pool building in said school district?

Each person voting on the above bonding proposition must be . . . (a) A citizen of the United States of America over twenty-one (21) years of age;

(b) A resident of the State of Michigan for six (6) months and of the School District for thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election;

(c) The owner of property assessed for taxes within the School District, or the lawful husband or wife of such owner;

(d) A registered elector in the city or township in which he resides.

TAKE NOTICE, that the Board of Education has estimated the expense of erecting and furnishing a swimming pool building to be \$500,000.00, all of which it is necessary to raise by borrowing and issuing bonds of the District.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the bonds to be voted on at said election, if authorized to be issued, shall be payable from taxes to be levied without limitation as to rate or amount as provided by Article X, Section 27 of the Michigan Constitution.

Section (532), Chapter 8, Part II, Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, provides as follows:

"The inspectors of election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides."

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said annual election to be held June 12, 1961, is Friday, June 2, 1961. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on said Friday, June 2, 1961, are not eligible to vote at said annual election.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with City and Township Clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the Clerk's office is open for registration.
