REVISION OF PARKING METER ZONE
 Notice is hereby given that parking meter regulations have been revised in accordance with the following schedule and in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 418 of the City of Birmingham.

RESOLUTION NO. 611
 May 22, 1961
 Moved by Commissioner Roberts, Seconded by Commissioner Matt Wheeler, Ordinance No. 418, provides for parking meter zones to be established by Birmingham City Commission Resolution.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Two Hour Meter Zone be extended on the north side of Hunter Duce from Ferrelle to Hunter Boulevard on the east side of Park Street from Hamilton to Oakland, on the east side of Woodward Avenue from Ferrelle to Oak Street, included in this portion of Woodward Avenue adjacent to the access drive extending from Municipal Parking Lot No. 6 to a point approximately 245 feet south of Oak Street, on the west side of Woodward Avenue from Harmon to a point 138 feet north of the intersection. **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Section 11 of Resolution No. 1284, dated November 1, 1954 be amended as follows: After the words:

"**BROWNELL STREET**—West side from Maple to a point 111 feet south of the present description of the Two Hour Meter Zone on Resolution No. 1284, dated November 1, 1954 be amended as follows: After the words:

"**HAMILTON STREET**—North side from Ferrelle to Hunter Boulevard South side from a point 185 feet east of Woodward Avenue to Hunter Boulevard.

"**PARK STREET**—East side from Hamilton to Oakland.

WOODWARD AVENUE—East side, from Hunter Boulevard to Oak Street, North Woodward access drive from Municipal Parking Lot No. 6 on the south to a point approximately 245 feet south of Oak Street West side, from Harmon to a point 138 feet north.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this amendment shall become effective upon publication of this Resolution and the installation of the parking meters.
