Art Collection Goes to New York

An exhibition of more than 120 drawings and etchings by Umberto Boccioni from the collection of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Lewis Winston of Aspen Road, Birmingham, will be on view through Aug. 9 at the Museum of Modern Art, New York.

Thirteen additional works from the Winston collection are included in the comprehensive survey of Futurism which opened, simultaneously on May 30. After closing in New York on Sept. 12, Futurism will be shown at the Detroff Institute of Art.

THE WINSTON collection, consisting of outstanding examples from the most significant art movements of the past 50 years, includes the finest privately owned assembly of Futurist art in this country.
