REVISION OF PARKING METER

Notice is hereby given that parking meter regulations have been revised in accordance with the following schedule and in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 465 of the City of Birmingham.

RESOLUTION NO. 668
ADOPTED BY COMMISSIONER ROBERTS, Mayor, and COMMISSIONER BURGAM, Council, on June 15, 1961.

WHEREAS, this body is empowered under provisions of Ordinance No. 465 of the City of Birmingham to establish parking meter zones and the fee for parking of vehicles therein, and to establish the hours of operation during which parking meters shall be in operation;

WHEREAS, the City has acquired a public parking lot commonly called "Parking Lot No. 2," which is bounded on the west by Park Street, on the east by Park Street and on the north by the alley extending from Woodville Street to Park Street and on the south by the rear lot of the parcel known as "Parcel 11" inclusive of Oak Grove Addition, which lot is in the Parish of St. Ignace;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that said Lot No. 2, as above described be retained in the Parking Meter Zone.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that that portion of said Lot lying south of and parallel to the northern line of said Lot, shall be included in the Two Hour Meter Zone, and the charge for parking of vehicles therein shall be as follows:

Two Hours	10c
Four Hours	20c
Eight Hours	35c
Twelve Hours	50c

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all the remainder of said Lot shall be included in the Twelve Hour Meter Zone, and that the charge for parking of vehicles therein shall be as follows:

Two Hours	10c
Four Hours	20c
Eight Hours	35c
Twelve Hours	50c

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that meters to such Lot shall be in operation from 9:30 o'clock A.M. to 6:00 o'clock P.M. on days other than Sundays and the holidays designated under said Ordinance No. 465.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall be effective upon publication.

I'm writing this on the patio in the shade of that big, shagbark hickory. There are 45 more trees I can count between where I sit and the rock-lined stream across the front. But the kitchen is what sold us. Big as the living room and pine-paneled all around except for the brick fireplace wall which faces the outside Dutch door and the picture window dining nook with its old copper chandelier. The breakfast bar feeds three on one side and has a built-in, bed-sized couch facing the big fireplace on the other. The cabinets and cupboards—21 of them—will hold enough for a family three times our size.

We've lived here each of the four seasons, all beautiful. Now that we must move, we're selling for exactly what we've paid.
