

Artificial Leg Finds Way Back to Owner

WEST BLOOMFIELD—A different kind of "bleeding event" was abandoned at a church in Southfield last week. The note attached to it contained all the elements of an old-fashioned melodrama—except that the story has its beginnings in a theft on Feb. 4 of this year.

Out of the theme emerges a story of human generosity and at the same time, perhaps, one of human perversity.

The "foot" was an artificial leg and brace, stolen from the home of Mrs. Lincoln Fornash, 5125 Walnut Lake Road in West Bloomfield. It belonged to a member of the Fornash family.

The leg was left, all these months later, at the church and turned over to Southfield police. The note with it read, "You please try to find owner. We cannot sleep."

The message was made up of words cut out of a magazine and pasted to a piece of plain paper.

The only clue to its ownership was the words "for Mabel" on the heel of the leg. Valued at \$1,000, the limb was relatively new.

West Bloomfield police also received an anonymous phone call that the leg would be left on church property in the area of Northwestern Highway.

Returned in good condition, it is now with its rightful owner.
