NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that in conformity with the "Michigan Election Law" the final date for registration in order to vote in the Primary Election is Monday, June 26, 1961, at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

TO VOTE AT THIS ELECTION, all persons must be registered. Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the Township of Bloomfield thirty days prior to July 25, 1961, are eligible to register.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, that any person who is not already registered upon the registration books of said township may register on or before June 26, 1961, during regular office hours, Monday thru Friday of each week, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and on the LAST DAY, Monday, June 26, 1961, from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 8:00 o'clock p.m.

TO TRANSFER a registration from one address to another WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, send a signed request to the office of the Township Clerk, stating present address, former address, and date of moving to present address. Such transfer may be made any time up to and including June 26, 1961 at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Those persons who have already registered under the permanent registration system and have voted within the last four years do not have to re-register.
