Odetta Emulates No One: She's Developed Own Style

Name the most exciting singers to emerge in the past decade and the list must surely include the remarkable ODETTA, a musical descendant of Bes-sic Smith and Leadbelly, although she emulates neither, nor anyone else.

Certainly in her own field of folk music there has been no voice in recent times with such varicolored richness of sound, or so emotionally generated, as Odetta's.

Odetta is no ordinary interpretive artist. She is in no one's tradition. So individual is her style, so personal her idiom, and so rare her gift of voice that she is a phenomenon among singers, impossible to imitate.

possible to imitate.

HER APPEARANCE on stage is itself arresting, and when she immerses herself in song she has the power to overwhelm. Against her blues, worksongs, bullabies and fantasies the massive guitar slung about her shoulders rings in stunning punctuation, counterpoints and rhythms, creating a spell for a singer and sudience alike.

Considering how potently the singing and song are mated in Odetta, it is surprising that she came upon folk music fortuitously and relatively late in life. Yet, listening to her sing, one is forced to believe it inevitable that she could have found this mode of expression for herself.

No composer or tunesmith scored lit with rigid rules of key and tempo and rests. The simple people who handed down the unwritten songs from generation to generation by vote allowed plenty of latityde for personal interpretation.

These are songs that arise from experience and grow in re-experience. In music, as in anything else, Odetta prefers finding her own way, and the songs she chooses are not necessarily these most requested by audiences but songs that mirror her own yearnings, sympathies and imaginings.

When Odetta was six her family uprooted itself from Birmingham, Alas where she was born and moved on the sum of t


