County GOP Establishes 1st College Scholarship

The first college scholarship fund ever to be established by a political party was announced today by the Republican Committee of Oakland County.

Arthur G. Elliott Jr., county GOP chairman, said the scholarship will be financed by proceeds from the organization's county-wide "Neighbor-to-Neighbor" fund drive.

Elliott explained that the fund initially will include \$280 to cover the cost of one year's tuition at Michigan State University - Oakland. It will be awarded on the basis of need and ability to a student who intends to pursue a career in journalism.

DR. D. B. VARNER, MSU-O chancellor, called the GOP scholarship "a meaningful contribution to the community."

"It represents a historic milestone for political parties," Varnar said. "We're honored that MSU-O was chosen as the recipient."

Alvin R. Balden, Huntington Woods, and Mrs. Richard C. Van Dusen, 32205 Bingham, Birmingham, co-chairman of the "Neighbor-to-Neighbor" drive, said they hope the scholarship fund will be expanded in the future.

"IDEALLY WE'D like to have the funds for an annual four-year scholarship, but it will depend on the availability of funds," they said.

Elliott named C. Ray Ballard, Huntington Woods, as chairman of a special committee to work with MSU-O officials in setting up procedure for awarding the scholarship.

Ballard, a high school teacher, said he plans to name six members to his committee, one from each of the county's six legislative districts.

75 Water Mishaps Cause 51 Deaths

Seventy-five water accidents have already caused 51 deaths and injured 29 persons in Michigan this year, according to State Police. The toll has emphasized the need for increased safety precautions as the water sports season toward its peak of high activity.

Of the accidents, 49 were fatal, 16 persons injured and property damage only. The information is based on reports received from all police agencies through June 14.

The drownings include 21 who fell into water from bridges, banks, docks or piers, eight boat passengers, seven who fell through ice, two boat operators, eight swimmers or waders, one skin diver, and one who lost his life while trying to rescue another.

Eligible Teachers In Area Can Apply For Social Security

All area teachers eligible for social security benefits may apply for compensation for the summer months, the research division of the Michigan Education Association announced.

Any woman teacher aged 62 or over and any man teacher aged 65 or over who has met the work requirements for social security is advised to contact his local social security office at once to apply for such benefits during June, July, and August.

HOWEVER, TEACHERS are not eligible if they earn more than \$100 during each of these months or render substantial services in self-employment, according to the research division.

Teachers who qualify may be eligible even though they are paid on a 12-month basis since they earn the money during the school year.

The research division's findings are confirmed by the Lansing Social Security Office.

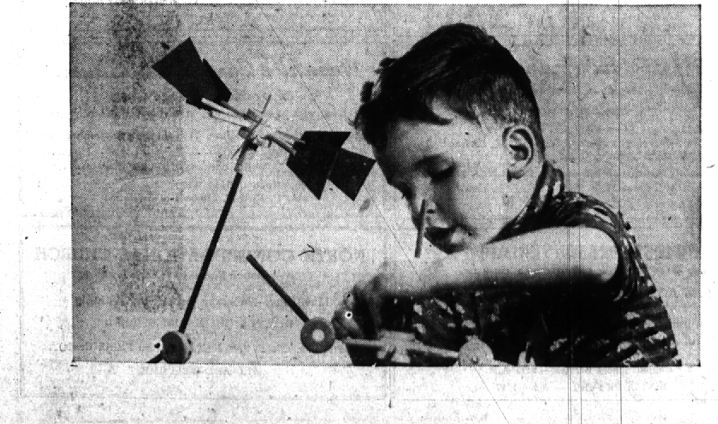
