Pine Hill Receives Members Sunday

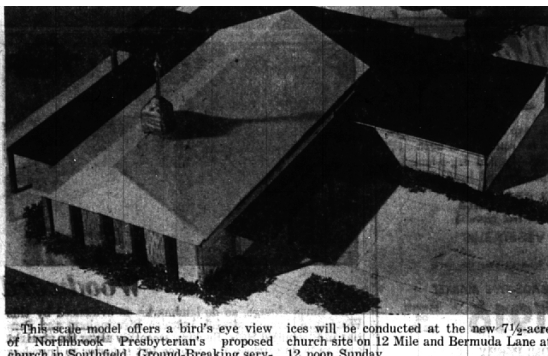

Northbrook Breaks Ground Sunday

Ground-breaking services will be held on the site of the new Northbrook Presbyterian Church at 12:00 noon Sunday. The new church will be located on the 7 1/2-acre site at 12 Mile and Bermuda Lane in Southfield. The first unit constructed will be a large fellowship hall and a wing of educational classrooms. Robert E. Wunderlich, chairman of the building committee, and "It will look like a church, and it will feel like a church, contemporary in design—not too extreme, but modern enough to complement the architecture of the surrounding area." THE FIRST UNIT will be constructed west of the corner to allow for future expansion toward the east. Subsequent units will include additional educational facilities and a sanctuary. Adequate parking facilities will also be provided. The Northbrook Presbyterian Church organized as a congregation last October with 181 charter members. Its current membership is 220. The Rev. William Hudson Downey, pastor of the church, was called last June as the "organizing" minister. THE CONGREGATION has been meeting at the Northbrook Elementary School on 12 Mile for the past 3 1/2 years.

Deacon Ordained At Christ Church

The Rev. John Albrecht, 932 Fairfax, Birmingham, a member of Cranbrook School faculty, was recently ordained to the priesthood at Christ Church. The Rt. Rev. Robert L. DeWitt, Suffragan Bishop of Michigan and former Christ Church rector, ordained Rev. Albrecht. Rev. Albrecht was presented by the Rev. Gerald B. O'Grady, rector of Christ Church, and the sermon was delivered by Dr. Reel Howe, director of Cranbrook's Institute for advanced Pastoral Studies.

MASTER of ceremonies was the Rev. Carl R. Sayers, vicar of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. Serving as bishop's chaplains were the Rev. Louis C. Gillette, vicar of Nativity Episcopal Church, Birmingham, and the Rev. John W. Wigle, rector of The Church of the Advent, Orchard Lake. A graduate of the Virginia Theological Seminary, Rev. Albrecht was the Marquis Fellow of Christ Church for 1959-60. IN JUNE 1959 he was ordained to the Diaconate in the Diocese of western Massachusetts. In the fall of 1960 he joined the Cranbrook School faculty as a full-time master, teaching religion and English. Rev. Albrecht will be guest speaker at the 10 a. m. service of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church on July 2.

The choirs recorded their entire performance of the Pergolesi "Stabat Mater" and four other works from their repertoire.
