

Crabrook Plans Two Concerts

A double program is in store for music lovers Sunday at Crabrook. The second concert in the Crabrook Summer Music Festival, featuring Karl Haas and a woodwind quartet, will take place in the outdoor Greek Theatre at 4:30 p.m. Preceding the program, which is sponsored by the Crabrook Music Guild, Sidney Giles, assistant carillonist at the University of Michigan, will present a carillon concert at 3:45 p.m. in Christ Church Cranbrook. A NATIVE of Toronto, Canada, Mr. Giles is a graduate of the carillon school at Mechelen, Belgium, and has played recitals in Indianapolis, the University of Chicago, Riverside Church in New York City, and the House of Parliament, Toronto. Crabrook is located on Lone Pine Road in Bloomfield Hills.

Hills General Will Direct AF Program

Brig. General John W. Richardson, 92 Grandview, Bloomfield Hills, will direct part of the Continental Air Command's new Reserve Recovery program. General Richardson, deputy commander of the Fifth Air Force Reserve Region at Selfridge Air Force Base, is responsible for the establishment of units in a 13-state area stretching from Michigan to Wyoming. The recovery program, which will go into operation July 1, calls for 282 reserve recovery units, 82 recovery groups and 200 recovery squadrons.

The 851ST Recovery Group, commanded by Col. Ralph Freedman, will be located at Selfridge AFB. The mission of these air reserve recovery units is to provide recovery airfields and associated facilities to U.S. and Allied aircraft in the event of attack or national emergency. Military planners expect that many U.S. air force bases may be destroyed or badly damaged in the event of an attack, and that some aircraft returning from initial combat missions may not be able to land at their regular bases.

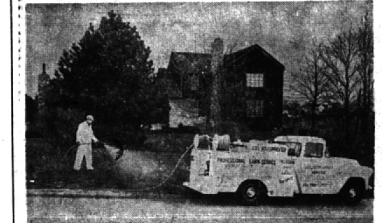
UNDER THE NEW Air Force Reserve Recovery program, reserve squadrons at recovery sites would provide landing and emergency facilities, such as communications, crash and rescue services, refueling, transportation, medical care, food service, maintenance, billeting and security. These functions will be accomplished to a large degree without regular military equipment and will require much cooperation and assistance from the civilian population at and near the recovery sites. Air Reservists will receive on-the-job training at the civilian landing fields. Detroit Reservists will be trained at Detroit Metropolitan and Willow Run Airports.

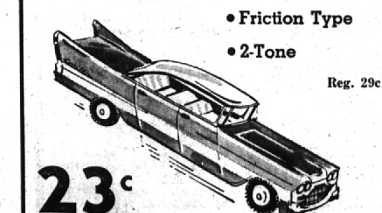

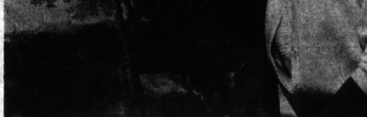
