Marie Cecile Cosgrove Weds Donald E. Liposky

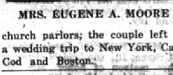

The bridegroom is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Vincent A. Liposky of Royal Oak.

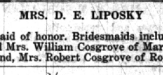
GOWNED IN CANDLELIGHT
