

# College Problems Need Better Communication

A leading Michigan Republican and head of Michigan State University-Oakland today jointly called for better communication between the legislature and higher education in resolving the problems of state-supported colleges and universities.

Arthur G. Elliott Jr., Oakland county GOP chairman, and Dr. J. R. Farmer, MSU-O chancellor, issued the call after a meeting between Varner and Oakland GOP legislators to discuss the problems of higher education in general and MSU-O in particular.

Elliott, who conducted the meeting, said he hoped it would "point the way to better rapport between the legislature and all elements of higher education."

TAKING PART in the discussion were State Senator Farrell E. Roberts (R., Pontiac) and State Representatives Henry M. Hogan (R., Birmingham), Lloyd L. Anderson (R., Waterford), Raymond L. Baker (R., Berkley) and William Hayward (R. Royal Oak).

Elliott called the meeting "highly productive. It gave our lawmakers a better insight into the problems of MSU-O and acquainted university officials with the problems and responsibilities of the legislature."

Elliott said plans were made for future meetings between Oakland lawmakers and MSU-O authorities.

"WE HOPE THESE meetings will be bipartisan, with both Republican and Democratic legislators participating," Elliott said.

# New Courthouse Wing Modeled at Meeting

The 85-member Oakland County Board of Supervisors faced a long agenda Monday night just a look at a mock-up of the \$13 million administrative wing of the new county courthouse. It will be built this fall.

The model of the three-story wing was shown by representatives of O'Dell, Hewlett and Luckenbach, Birmingham architects. The wing will house offices now in the County Office Building in Pontiac.

The full board was asked to authorize the board of auditors to advertise for construction bids. The wing will be attached to the western end of the six-story courthouse tower unit in the County Service Center.

# Parking Prohibited On M-24 Stretch

A businessman's interest in traffic safety has resulted in a ban on parking on a short section of M-24 south of Lake Orion in Oakland County. The parking ban was announced by the State Highway Department.

Parking is being removed from 550 feet of M-24 south of the Oakland County Road Commission garage to eliminate what the Highway Department said would be a hazardous condition created by cars parked along the highway.

The restriction was requested by the owner of a new miniature golf course who said the Highway Department in a letter that he was providing "plenty of off-street parking" for his customers.

THE OWNER, Leonard J. Gantner, of Lake Orion, said he was making his request in the interest of traffic safety.

The no parking order followed cooperative safety studies by the Highway Department, State Police and local authorities. It will have immediate effect.

THE REQUEST covers five employees for the maintenance department, two for the sheriff's office and two additional clerks for the auditors. All would be employed in connection with the new courthouse. Other DFW matters on the agenda were proposals to add 7 1/2 acres
