Speed Limits View
Automobile Club of Michigan views speed limits as not always meaning it is safe to travel at the speeds the signs indicate. Although there is ample evidence that it is safe to drive at the legal limit on freeways and expressways, there is just as much proof that legal speed limits on other types of highways are not necessarily safe. The Memorial Day weekend saw 33 people killed in traffic; none on freeways and only three on urban expressways. Many involved speed which, while legal, was not safe.

Study Methods to Control Parking Lot 5 Traffic

Birmingham city commissioners agreed Monday night on methods for controlling traffic inside Municipal Parking Lot No. 5 but postponed decision for controlling traffic outside the lot.
They accepted Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley's recommendation to paint directional lines on the pavement to move cars in and out of the lot.
But they want the Chamber of Commerce parking committee to study his recommendations concerning the Woodward Ave. entrance-exit before they take action.
Moxley pointed out that the entrance-exit has been located as far north of the Woodward-Oakland-Willits intersection as possible, to reduce congestion.

RECOMMENDED:
1) Angle parking on the east side of Woodward from Oakland to Euclid be changed to parallel parking.
2) Parking on the west side of Woodward from Euclid to Willits be prohibited. (Parking now is prohibited at a point 20 feet north of Oakland.)
3) Two lanes for northbound traffic and two for southbound be installed, plus an additional south-bound lane next to the curb on the west side to permit right turns into the lot.
4) A center lane for left turns from the lot for northbound traffic and for left turns into Oakland for southbound traffic be installed.

Commissioners Decide Against Redding Sewer

The Redding Road boys were back before the Birmingham City Commission Monday night but much more amicably this time than on their last appearance.
This time, they let their attorney speak for them.
At a public hearing four weeks ago, the property owners objected emphatically to a proposed sewer on Redding from Chesterfield west about 1,500 feet. They were, to put it bluntly, unruly.
SO, IN the end, commissioners expressed confidence in the city administrator but agreed that there was no necessity at this time.
They passed unanimously a motion to declare no necessity, but without prejudice to future consideration.
Commissioner William E. Roberts, who missed the first session when the sewer was discussed, said he was "very pleased the meeting this evening has proceeded as it did. It was disturbed over the first one."
More emphatic was Commissioner Charles Brewster, who commented: "In 10 years on this commission, I have never seen an exhibition like that the people on Redding Road put on. It was shocking to me."
The group was not represented by an attorney the first time.
