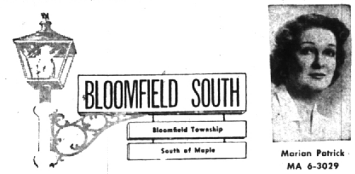


## New Correspondent

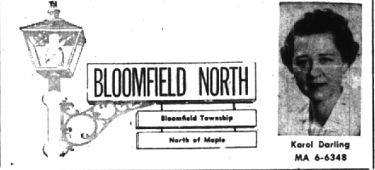

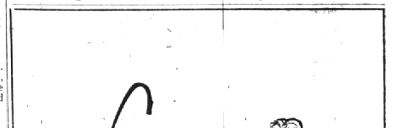
