County GOP To Support Con-Con Plan

Oakland County Republicans will give solid support to the con-con proposition on the April 3 ballot, Arthur G. Elliott Jr., county GOP chairman, has declared.

At a recent meeting of party workers in Birmingham, Elliott said the stand on con-con "will be the same as our position in our August 1960, convention the fall campaign and our January, 1961, convention — overwhelmingly in favor of con-con."

ELLIOTT EMPHASIZED that Oakland's position "in no way conflicts" with the state GOP's position taken at the Republican convention in Detroit Feb. 4.

"While the state con-con resolution may not have been as forceful as some would like," Elliott explained, "it is by no means as compromising as it has been made to appear."

"The state GOP position is not against con-con — the matter has simply been left to individual discretion," Elliott said.

ELLIOTT NOTED that Oakland county voters endorsed con-con 3 to 1 in the November, 1960, election.

Elliott disclosed that he has urged the GOP state central committee to take immediate steps to develop research and training programs "to acquaint con-con delegates with the complexities and responsibilities" of constitutional revision.

Cammareri Heads Easter Seal Drive In Local Area

J. King Ward Jr., president of the Oakland County Society for Crippled Children and Adults, has announced that the annual fund drive in county begins today, one month prior to Easter.

Ward said that this year's appeal, which marks 40 years of service, will be needed to carry on the work which the society is doing for the benefit of the crippled children and handicapped in Oakland County.

MATTHEW Cammareri of Birmingham, general Easter Seal chairman, has already appointed area chairmen for the various communities who will assist in the fund raising by conducting Lily Parades and the distribution of canisters in their respective areas.

Cammareri is also the Birmingham area chairman.

Interstate Route Work Begins In County Area

Work has started on contracts totaling more than \$4 million on Interstate routes 75 and 696 in Oakland County, the State Highway Department has announced.

Contractor S. D. Solomon & Sons of Lansing started a \$3,573,564 job for 4.8 miles of Interstate 75 from Walton Blvd., on Pontiac's northeast corner, westerly to Baldwin Road.

INCLUDED IN the project are interchanges at M-24, three miles north of Pontiac; at Baldwin road, 1.4 miles north of Pontiac and a grade separation at Giddings road. Completion date on the contract is Sept. 30, 1962.

HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER John C. Mackie has named J. O. Smith project engineer on the job. He asks that any affected property owners direct questions to Smith at 2651 E. Walton Blvd., Pontiac.

Contractor Louis A. Garavaglia, Warren, started work on the Drake road grade separation, the first of five structures on Interstate 696 included in his \$475,958 contract.

THE PROJECT also calls for grade separations at Hargerty, Halstead and Middlebelt Roads and a connecting ramp between I-596 and the Brighton-Farmington Freeway. Completion date on the five structures is Oct. 15, 1961.
