

Lathrup to Meet March 13 to Study 12 Mile Property

LATHRUP—The council has set March 13 at 8 p.m. for a study meeting with residents from both sides of Roseland, west of Southfield, to deliberate on possible solutions to use of 12 Mile property.

The zoning board of appeals will be present as well as City Attorney Everett Hayes.

THE PROPERTY covers one block west of Southfield Road, from

Guy Place to Bloomfield and one block from Bloomfield to Santa Barbara. Also included in discussion will be one block east from Guy Place.

The meeting is a follow-up on a zoning board recommendation for further review of proposed multiple dwelling amendments to the zoning ordinance. The zoning board rejected the amendments in January.

THEY REPORTED that almost all of the 30 people present at a Jan. 4 public hearing were opposed to any zoning change of 12 Mile Road.

The council said the property should be utilized and hopes to effect a compromise between objectors' opposition and a practical approach to use of the land.

Traffic Sign Action Taken In Lathrup Guild to Meet

LATHRUP—Four-way stop signs, installed on a 90-day trial basis at Wilshire and Eldorado, will be left up the council decided Monday night.

In a three-part resolution, the council also okayed installation of yield-right-of-way signs on Sunset at Bloomfield and voted to continue yield signs at Roseland, facing Bloomfield.

LOCATION OF the traffic signs at the three locations was recommended by the road and traffic safety advisory committee and the police department.

A request from Fred A. Wilson to install a traffic light on Southfield at the Professional Office Building was not acted upon.

Mayor Richard N. Cogger reported that the county road commission will paint school crosswalk lines once a year, provided a request is made by the school district administration by July 1.
