

Summer Classes In Driver Training Offered in S'field

Summer driver training classes will be sponsored by Southfield High School for all residents of the Southfield School District seeking a driver's license.

State law requires that all persons obtaining licenses for the first time successfully complete a course in driver training.

Three sections of "on-the-road" training will be offered: June 19-July 7, July 10-July 28; and July 31-August 18. In addition to taking one of these sections, the student must attend classroom sessions which will be given June 19-June 30 from 8-6 p.m.

No tuition will be charged for the course, which will be available to 180 applicants. No registrations will be accepted after April 15. Interested persons should contact Sanford Burr at Southfield High School.

Issue Warrant Against Driver In Fatal Crash

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — A negligent homicide warrant has been issued by the Oakland County prosecutor's office against a Royal Oak man, Leroy F. Ederly, in a two-car crash that took the life of a Berkeley man Friday morning.

Vernon M. Libstaff, 46, was killed and his wife injured in the collision which occurred at 1:48 a.m. on Square Lake at Franklin Road.

Ederly was also injured in the accident, as well as a passenger in his car, a Bloomfield Hills woman

Mrs. Virginia B. Richey.

LIBSTAFF DIED at 3:05 a.m. in St. Joseph Mercy Hospital. His wife, Thelma, is reported in satisfactory condition at the same hospital, suffering a broken rib and ribs and severe face cuts.

Ederly was released from St. Joseph's Monday, Mrs. Richey, 38, of 4891 Haddington, Bloomfield Hills, was reported in "fair condition" at St. Joseph's.

THE ACCIDENT occurred when Ederly, heading west on Square Lake Road, attempted a left turn into the driveway of the Lee Motel, near the intersection.

Ederly's vehicle struck Libstaff's car and both cars then collided with a tree. Libstaff had just made a left turn off Telegraph Road onto Square Lake Road, according to Sgt. Martin McLaughlin of the township police.

Dr. Knox will give his second lecture in a series of two on when a child should be given responsibility and how much responsibility a parent can expect at various ages.

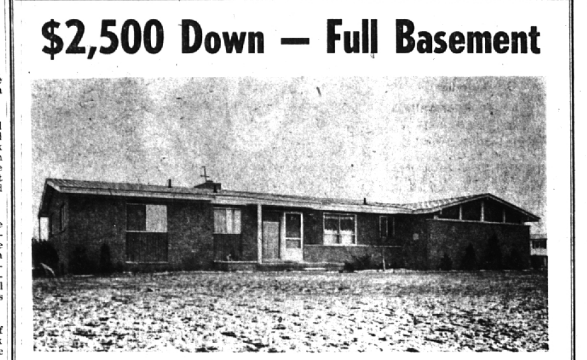
HIS SECOND lecture will be devoted specifically to answering questions asked by parents at the January meeting.
