against the front wall. THE BALL sped back to Khan, who then smashed it against the right hand wall. The ball hit three walls and ricocheted back like a bullet.

GILES, WHO performed in tennis and squash tournaments throughout the world, proved an admirable competitor for Khan. But the amazing "world's best" came back with shots that thrilled the gallery.

After a while, Khan showed some of his fancy shots. A sort of Bob Cousy of squash, with behind the back smashes.

The Pakistani took three of four games, 15-13, 15-10, 11-15 and 15-11. And after more than an hour's play at full speed, he wasn't even breaking a sweat.

MORE THAN in any other sport, sportsmanship and ethics are the foundation of squash racquets. A player must give his opponent an opportunity to return the ball. He must get out of his way. If not, he is penalized. The court is only 32 feet long and 18 feet wide. The size of a player has little to do with the result of a match. Hashim Khan stands only five feet, five inches. The game is to the player with speed, accuracy, endurance and skill. After four games, Giles called it quits. The usual competition match is the best three of five games.

THE GALLERY, by this time, was ecstatic in their appreciation of the fine play of the visitor. They wanted to see more.

Khan conceded. He played two more matches.

The little dynamo has competed against his touring relatives. No one of them dominates any of the others.

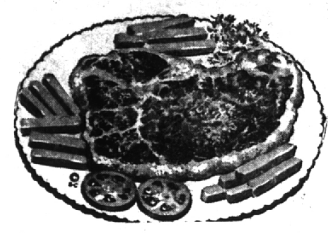
