Board Members To Gather For Luncheon

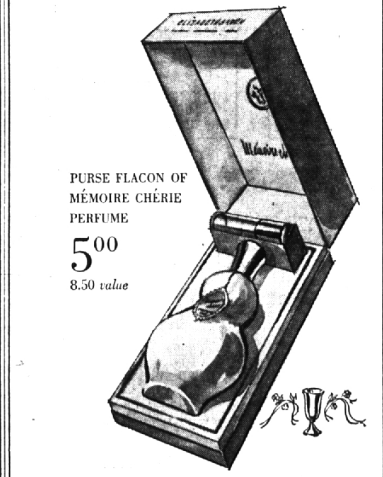
