

Troy Considers Taking Broomfield Will Speak Case to Supreme Court At Ford Awards Night

Troy city commissioners may take a step which would set a precedent in Michigan concerning a city's right to enforce a master zoning plan. The step being considered is taking its case to the State Supreme Court.

A suit brought by developer Robert L. Silberstein of Detroit challenging Troy zoning according to a special study session of the commission.

Silberstein, who owns 200 acres in the northwestern section of the city near South Boulevard and Coolidge Highway, won his case in Oakland County Circuit Court.

CIRCUIT JUDGE H. Russell Holland ruled that Silberstein could not be forced to build homes on the proposed housing development on half-acre lots as required by Troy's present zoning ordinance.

It was contended by the city that zoning for that particular area was set up in such a manner because the proposed development is located in the city's Evergreen sewer district.

According to City Attorney Stanley E. Burke, the Evergreen system would be inadequate to serve the population which would result from building on lots smaller than a half acre.

BURKE CLAIMED that Judge Holland's ruling, which states the city cannot force a developer to comply with zoning requirements in an area where maximum population growth may not be required for 40 years, questions a city's right to set up and enforce its zoning plan.

Newberg Granted Injunction on Pact

Friday's first court day in the legal entanglements between former Chrysler president William C. Newberg of Bloomfield Hills and Chrysler Corp. brought four moves by visiting Judge Henry L. Beers of Muskegon who drew the assignment.

A temporary injunction was granted to Newberg preventing Chrysler from further collecting on the \$455,000 which Newberg agreed to pay after resigning June 30 in a dispute over conflicts of interest. The \$455,000 represented profits he received from two companies which supplied small parts to Chrysler. Newberg has already paid \$200,000.

Judge Beers made the injunction dependent upon Newberg furnishing bond to insure Chrysler gets the remaining \$255,000 if Newberg loses the case.

A Chrysler motion to strike out certain parts of Newberg's complaint was denied by Judge Beers. "I don't see anything wrong with the allegations," he said, "that will be a matter for proof."

A request by Chrysler for a temporary injunction which would prevent Newberg from proceeding with his \$5.25 million personal damage suit against Chrysler president and board chairman L. L. Colbert until after the Wayne County suit is decided was taken under advisement.

The suit's attorney Nathan B. Goodnow and Newberg's attorney Joseph Louisell agreed to delay the personal damage suit until 15 days after Judge Beers rules on the temporary injunction request. No date has been set for that hearing.
