Herzberg Explains Development Plan To Library Board

Birmingham City Planner Herbert Herzberg attended the Feb. 28 meeting of the Baldwin Public Library board to explain details of the Central Business District plan.

Herzberg outlined the various parking lots and a ring road for routing traffic around the periphery of the city.

Library board members expressed concern over the possibility of closing Bates to automobile traffic.

Upon the board's inquiry as to

the course to be taken in registering formal disapproval of the plan, Herzberg said that no such action would be necessary and that he would bear their comments in mind.

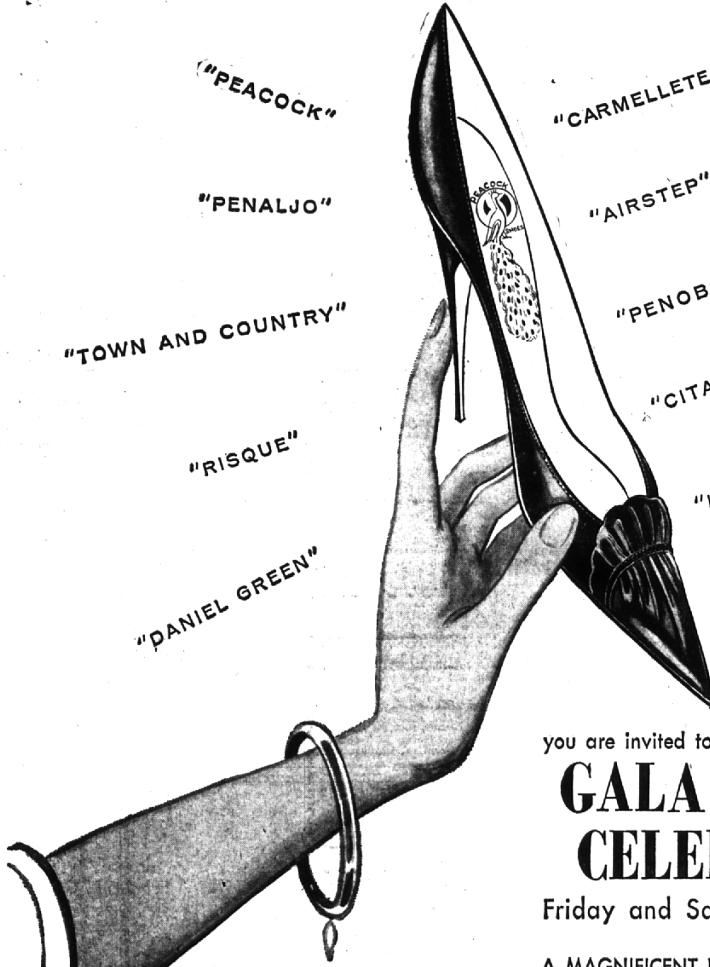
IN OTHER BUSINESS the board authorized the purchase of floor mats at a cost of \$197.50 for the library to reduce floor maintenance.

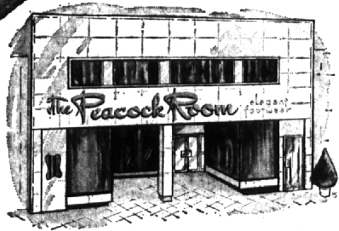
