Three Children Drown in Lake

WEST BLOOMFIELD — Two young sisters and a 3-year-old boy were drowned in Pleasant Lake last Thursday. The three children fell through thawing ice into five feet of water after wandering away from a nearby playground. The victims were Lynda Marie, 5, and Cheryl Anne, 3 daughters of Mr. and Mrs. William E. Pettibone of Pontiac and Ricky Rose of Milford. All were dead on arrival at Pontiac Osteopathic Hospital at 5:30 p.m., in spite of efforts at the lakeside to revive them with mouth-to-mouth breathing and oxygen administered by a fire department resuscitator crew.

THE CHILDREN with Mr. and Mrs. Pettibone were visiting the Orin Hoffman family at 6532

Brockhurst. Mrs. Hoffman and Mrs. Pettibone are sisters. The Rosen boy accompanied the Pettibones on the visit, as his mother was recuperating from pneumonia at home.

Debbie Hoffman, 7, and her sister Joanne, 5, ran home from the playground to report the children had fallen into the water. Hoffman and Pettibone ran to the lake where they saw the three children floating in the water. They jumped into the lake to recover the bodies and attempted mouth-to-mouth breathing.

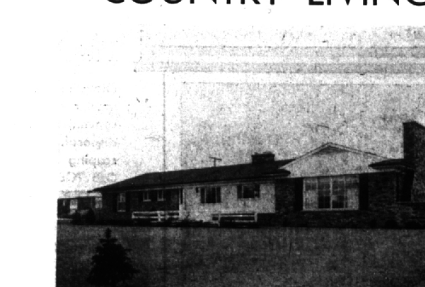

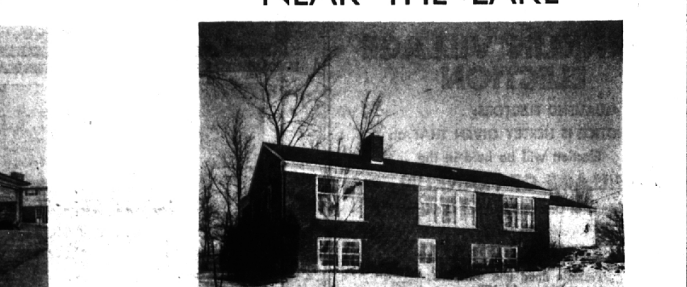
