Fire Department Issues Report For February

The Birmingham Fire Dept. made 30 runs during February at a total estimated loss by fire of \$9,100 was reported, according to a monthly summary issued by the department.

A total of \$714,600 worth of property was endangered by fire and an estimated total of \$615,100 worth of insurance was carried on these buildings and contents, the report said.

Inspections for February totalled 120 with action by the department necessary in only four cases. Actual time spent on fire fighting, rescue work and investigations was 12:40 hours with 107:50 hours spent on fire prevention bureau inspections.

Some 67.5 miles were travelled enroute to fires by department cars and trucks and 2,026 gallons of water were pumped.

OF FIRE DAMAGE, \$6,800 was estimated as loss on buildings and \$2,300 on contents to make the \$9,100 total. Estimated insurance paid matched these figures.

There were no false alarms in February; six of the total 30 runs were first aid calls.

The department report also included figures on hours spent on well investigations, well work and hydrant inspections and paintings.

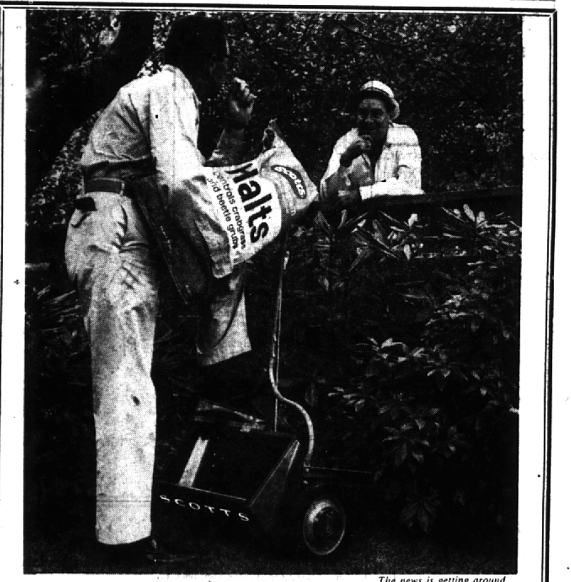
