## Roll Determined For Alley Paving

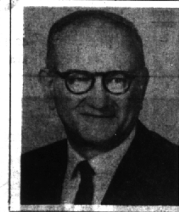
Birmingham city commissioners Monday night determined the roll for a special assessment district for paving the 55 Woodward alley on the east side from Ruffner to Sheffield.

## Kite Flying Contest Will Open Saturday

A kite flying contest sponsored by the Birmingham Optimist Club and Recreation Board will be held 1 p. m. Saturday at Poppleton Park. All children 6 through 12 years of age may participate in one of the three age divisions as follows:

- Division I: Children 6 to 8 years
- Division II: Children 9 and 10 years
- Division III: Children 11 and 12 years

Plaques will be awarded to the highest flying kite in each division and award ribbons will be presented to first, second and third place winners for the largest kite, smallest kite and the most unusual kite.

All kites must fly a minimum of 10 minutes to be eligible for an award and only homemade kites will be eligible for the "most unusual" award.

EACH PARTICIPANT is allowed to have one assistant to help launch his kite and a distance of 100 feet will be allowed to get the kite into the air. The kite reaching the highest point after 15 minutes from launching time will be considered winner of the highest flying award.

All children wishing to participate should bring their kites to Poppleton Park, Oxford and Mohegan Streets, at 1 p. m. Saturday.

## B'ham OK's New Plan For 12 Towns Drain

Solution to the Twelve Towns Drain is one step closer to reality today.

Birmingham city commissioners Monday night granted tentative approval to a plan that would reduce Madison Heights' apportionment and increase Birmingham's.

Royal Oak, which would absorb most of the costs lifted from Madison Heights, has referred the proposal to its legal counsel for study and recommendation.

If all 12 member communities approve the proposal, Madison Heights is expected to drop its appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court on a recent ruling against that city by the state high court.
