Shall Article X of the Michigan Constitution be Amended by Adding a New Section 29 to Provide that the Credit of the State, up to \$5,000,000, may be granted, and only at the direction of a Legislative Act, to or in aid of Public Benefit Corporations for the purpose of Financing Industrial, Manufacturing and Municipal Development Projects in this State?
