Addition of a big new fire department pumper of a capacity of 750 gallons per minute was authorized on Monday night by the City Commission. Purchase of the added equipment was urged by City Manager D. C. Egburt and a resolution authorizing the purchase was offered by Mayor W. E. Moody.

Widening of West Maple Avenue, together with improvement of the lighting system is up for study and planning by the city. City Manager Donald C. Egburt recommended to the commission Monday that a study of the proposal be made under authority of the commission. He stated that much of the curb along this street was in anything but good shape and that some sidewalk needed replacing.

**Ingraham Wants River Rouge Lands For B'hm Parks**

City Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham has called for concerted action by the City toward obtaining "all lands" along the River Rouge in Birmingham as part of the public park system.

At last week's commission meeting, Ingraham requested that the city manager initiate a study of potential costs and the possibility of negotiating for properties involved. His request was granted.

**VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 48**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 29 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORES AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS; THE SIZE OF OPEN SPACES; THE DENSITY OF POPULATION; THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS AND LAND FOR TRADE, RESIDENCE AND OTHER PURPOSES; CREATING DISTRICTS FOR SAID PURPOSES AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH DISTRICTS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; ESTABLISHMENT OF A ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE."

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordinance:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 29 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating and Restricting the Height, Number of Stories and Size of Buildings; The Size of Open Spaces; The Density of Population; The Location and Use of Buildings and Land for Trade, Residence and Other Purposes; Creating Districts for said Purposes and Establishing the Boundaries Thereof; Providing for Changes in Regulations and Boundaries of Such Districts; Defining Certain Terms Used Herein; Providing for Enforcement; Establishment of a Zoning Board of Appeals; and Imposing Penalties for the Violation of this Ordinance" and the same hereby is amended by amending the Zone Map attached thereto and made a part thereof as follows:

A. That the following described property is changed from Single Family Residential One (R-1) zone use to Retail Business (B-2) zone use:

1. Beginning at a point on the East line of Section 2, 283 feet North of the Southeast corner of Section 2, T 1 N, R 10 E, thence North 92° 17' feet along the East line of Section 2, thence South 89° 42' 00" West 334 feet, thence South 57° 0' feet parallel with the East line of Section 2, thence South-easterly 70 ft., thence North 85° 29' East 283 feet to the point of beginning.

B. That the following described property is changed from Single Family Residential One (R-1) zone use to Non-Retail Business (B-1) zone use:

1. Beginning at a point 283 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 2, T 1 N, R 10 E, on the South line of Section 2, thence West 202 feet along the South line of Section 2, thence North 333 feet, thence East 110 feet parallel with the South line of Section 2, thence South-easterly 70 feet, thence South 283 feet to the point of beginning.

C. To change from Single Family Residential One (R-1) zone use to Single Family Residential Two (R-2) zone use:

1. Beginning from a point of the South line of Section 2, West 485 feet from the Southeast corner of Section 2, and North 333 feet, thence West 150 feet, thence South 333 feet, thence along the South line of Section 2, West 945 feet, thence North 1324.69 feet, thence East 349.47 feet, thence South approximately 961.15 feet parallel with the East line of Section 2, thence parallel with the South line of Section 2 West approximately 110 feet to the point of beginning.

Section 2.01. Public hearing having been held hereon March 29, 1961, and the statutory notices having been published and mailed, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety and hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, Michigan, on the 20th day of March, A. D. 1961.

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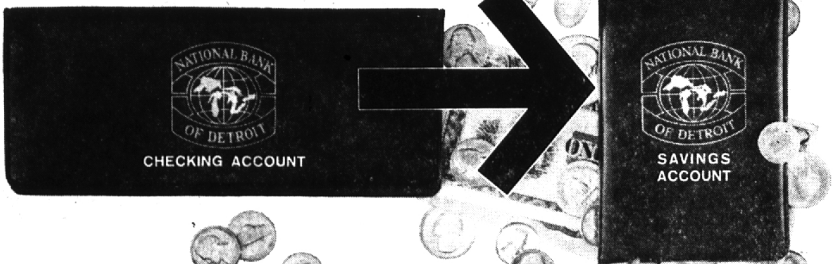
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
