## 2 Germans Praise Saarinen During Visit to Area

"A very lovely landscape," two German visitors said of Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills this week. They are Prof. Wilhelm Braun-Feldweg, an industrial designer, and Helmut Krueger, owner of a Berlin china-porcelain manufacturing concern.

Part of a group of 10 Berlin specialists studying problems of industrial design in this country, they came here to visit architect Eero Saarinen.

Their local hosts were Peter Kalinke, Birmingham, and Jack Jevitt, Lathrup. They're partners in the Old World Import Co.

PROFESSOR Braun-Feldweg said Saarinen is "very well known and respected in Germany."

Of the Saarinen's modernistic TWA terminal at Idlewild Airport in New York, Braun-Feldweg said, "I like it very much." (The architect's design is included in an exhibit on display through April 10 at Cranbrook Academy of Art Galleries.)

Krueger said many American architects have assisted in the rebuilding of West Berlin, which was 80 per cent destroyed during World War II.

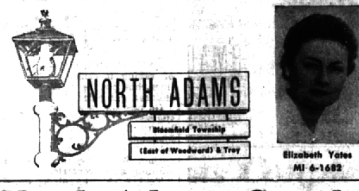
"Congress Hall, one of the most impressive buildings in Berlin, was designed by an American," he stated.

He spoke highly of American help through the European Rehabilitation Program.

"West Berlin," Krueger declared, "is a booming city."

So off went the dads and their enthusiastic little daughters to the Joe Capades and a dessert treat a Saturday afternoon recently. In the group were Charles Amann

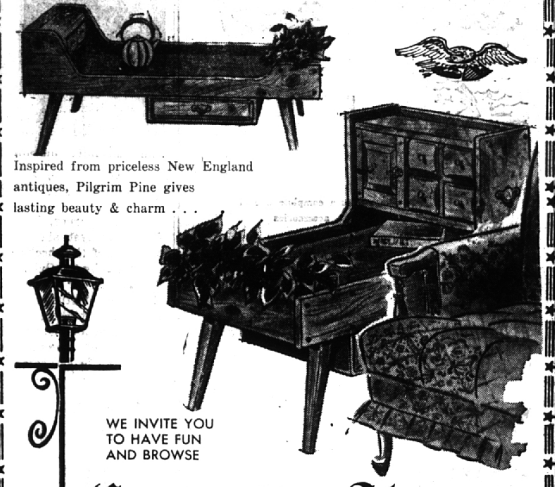

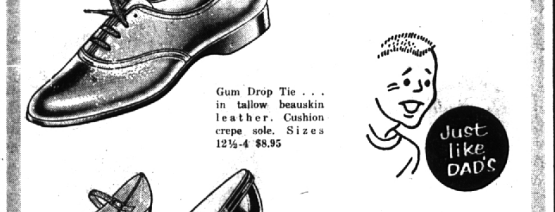

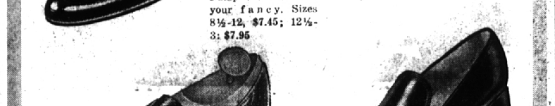
