Says New Jersey Club Had More Nat'l. Tourneys

To the Editor:
 The statement was made in the March 23 issue of *The Eccentric* that Oakland Hills Country Club "is the only club in the country which had the open tournament four times." (This is incorrect since Baltusrol Golf Club in Springfield, New Jersey, achieved that record in 1954.)
 Baltusrol which was founded in 1895 has had more national tournaments played over its course than any other club in the nation, nine in all.

IN ADDITION to four National Opens, it was host to three National Amateur championships

(1904, 1926 when George Von Elm defeated Bobby Jones, and 1940) and to two National Women's Championships (1901 and 1911).
 It had its first National Open in 1903, its second in 1915, its third in 1926 when Tony Manero won, and its fourth in 1954 when a record crowd of 40,000 saw Ed Furell win over Gene Littler and defending champ, Ben Hogan.
 Moreover, Baltusrol has its tenth national tournament coming up this year when it will be the scene of the Sixteenth Women's Open Championship.

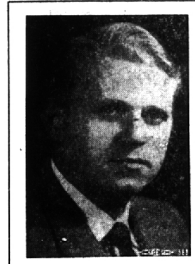
Named Chairman

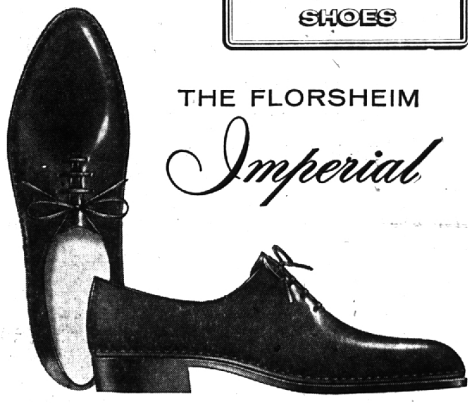
