AS DEFENDING champions the team again was entered in the Southeast Recreation League, going through the schedule undefeated and winning the title and the playoff tournament.

The team competed for the second year in the Inter-City Tournament of Champions. The cities competing were: Dearborn, Hamtramck, Detroit, East Detroit, Plymouth, Highland Park, Livonia, Berkley, Pontiac and Lathrup Village representing Southfield.

Playing at Garden City, Lathrup reached the final round by eliminating East Detroit and Dearborn. In the championship game against Pontiac, the boys, with a terrific team effort won 85-49, jumping into an unbelievable 50-14 half-time lead.
