Husband-Wife Team Win National Contest

A foursome of designers which includes a husband-wife team from Birmingham has won first place in the Mobile Home Park Professional Competition.

The national contest was to basically design a mobile home park. Mr. and Mrs. Manuel D. Dumlaio, 406 S. 14 Mile, Birmingham, Masao T. Itabashi, of Detroit, and Ralph T. Bergman, of Farmington, collectively utilized their spare time in the basement of the Dumlaio home to design the first place winner, and split the \$4,000 prize.

DUMLAIO, ITABASHI and Bergman work for Smith, Hinchman & Grylls Associates Inc., Detroit, while Mrs. Violeta Dumlaio is employed by Glen Paulsen & Associates, Bloomfield Hills. Dumlaio is senior architectural designer, the others designers.

The jury which decided the winners was particularly impressed with the way cluster systems of mobile homes were interwoven throughout the winning design and equally with the neat fitting of the topography.

More than 700 applications were accepted for the competition while there were over 200 entries.

MRS. DUMLAIO said the foursome had been working on the project in their spare time and weekends since January. During the week before the contest deadline they worked past midnight after their regular work was finished.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Dumlaio have their bachelor's degrees in architecture from University of Santo Tomas, Manila, Philippines, and their master's in architecture and fine arts from Cranbrook Academy of Art.

Previously Dumlaio won the grant for study of industrial design and a graduate assistantship in architecture at the Cranbrook school.

HE ALSO WON first prize in the 1957 Detroit Builders Home Show Competition and honorable mention in this year's Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial Competition.

Mr. and Mrs. Dumlaio have never worked for the same firm.

Poleo Joins Birmingham Landscape

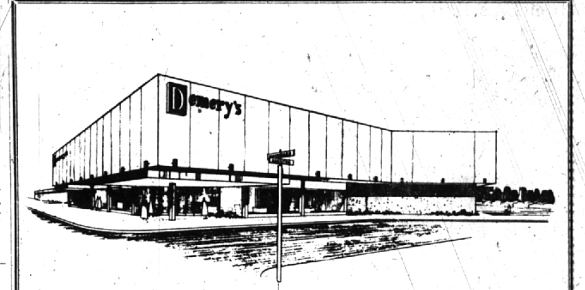
