Free Brochure On Mental Health Available To All

A free brochure describing the operations and benefits of aftercare programs for mentally ill children and adults is available from the Michigan Society for Mental Health, a Michigan United Fund Agency, Box 204, Detroit 31, Mich.

The brochure is a result of a two-year study made by the society's statewide committee on aftercare. The committee visited New York state's aftercare clinics, interviewed clinicians and patients, and studied the philosophy of the aftercare programs.

May Alter Tax Rate in County; Valuation Is Up

County-wide equalized property assessments show an increase of four and one-half per cent over the current tax base. The assessments have been set at \$2,094,683,180, an increase of \$66,904,080.

The increase may have an effect on tax allocation hearings which begin Wednesday when the tax allocation board is due to set tax rates for Oakland County and school districts.

The county has agreed to renewal of its current tax rate, figuring on a two per cent increase in the tax base. Current rate is \$5.48 per \$1,000 of equalized valuation.

The higher equalized valuation may mean the county can do with less. The county's tentative budget is balanced by \$286,000 from one of its surplus funds. If the county holds out for \$5.48, it would require only \$87,578 surplus to balance.

THE \$2,094,683,180 valuation, set by the county equalization committee, will be equalized by the state before local tax rates are set. Committee members have said privately they expect the state to accept the county figures or make only slight adjustment.

The state equalized valuation is the tax base for 19th county and school districts. Complete valuation figures are not out yet on school districts.
