SAN FRANCISCO — The last swan of springtime have twirled into space. The last kisses have been blown. Another voyage has begun.

Ten miles beyond the Golden Gate Bridge, the last tie with the harbor pilot leaves via launch at the lighthouse. The coast of California fades in the distance.

That's how it will be for those on the "Suburbia Sea Parties" this spring, aboard the SS. Lurline and Matsonia.

You'll have plenty of company — over a thousand persons, 700 of them passengers and 426 crew. Keeping things moving will be native-born Hawaiian hosts and hostesses who, besides helping passengers get to know each other, give complimentary hula lessons.

APPROACHING Honolulu, a festive welcome awaits the Lurline and Matsonia. Colorful catamarans (double-hulled sailboats) shore off from Walkiki Beach at sunrise on boat days to greet the liners offshore and escort them to dockside. There, the Royal Hawaiian Band plays, hula girls dance, and garlands of fragrant leis — Hawaii's famous "aloha gesture" — drape all passengers.

Also exciting are the turnaround sailings. Many passengers, fresh from the beach, board in shorts and moccasins. The lei ladies, lined up at dockside, work at breakfast speed strapping blossoms together to meet the "More! More!" demand.

POPS of champagne corks echo around the ship. And from many passageways you hear the scraps of newly-learned Hawaiian songs and the pink-plunk sound of ukuleles.

Suddenly the whistle blasts. The band strikes up the sentimental and stately "Aloha Oe." Coconut hats are waved in farewell. Slowly, slowly, the ship backs out, turns, and heads in the direction of California, followed for a short ways by scores of small boats.

As the liner sweeps past Diamond Head, the traditional custom of tossing leis to the wind is observed by many a tearful passenger.

If you're lei can be seen floating toward shore, that's a sure sign you'll return to Hawaii — and soon.

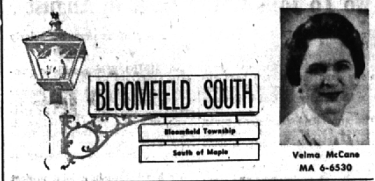
