

### W. Beverly Group To Build Gateway To Association

BEVERLY HILLS—George Dettinger, president of the West Beverly Association, Monday was granted permission from village officials to erect a four-by-eight-foot aluminum and brick gateway at the entrance of the association.

According to Dettinger, the structure will bear a map of the interior street pattern of the association and will probably be located at the Southfield-Beverly-Riverside intersection.

The white brick entrance marker will cost an estimated \$1,000.

COUNCILMAN Dr. Douglas Wood was the only objector to the project. He claimed that the maintenance would probably fall on the village in future years and stated it would most likely become unusable.

Dettinger assured him that the association would maintain the entryway, including the initial landscaping and lighting.
