Floors Need Good Bounce. Says Expert

Women are rediscovering the comforts of wood floors.

Floors built of wood are definitely on the way back, believes H. V. Simpson, executive head of the West Coast Lumbermen's Association, who points out that several recent surveys have indicated women's dislike of unyielding slab floors.

SAVE YOUR feet, says this expert, waik on wood. The extra bounce in wood, says this man, helps to cushion the shock transmitted to the skeletal system by walking.

Tired feet, the chiropodist points out, can cause head and back aches, jangled nerves, tired muscles and other physical disorders, even dislocated discs. When the floor we walk on does not give, he said, there is added strain on the feet. Stand around or walk all day oconcrete and see what I mean, he suggests.

SIMPSON SAID that a properly built floor of wood joists is designed to give slightly under walking. A joist floor of sturdy Douglas fir, braced to give it a cantelevered effect and properly covered with sheathing lumber and floor boards, has never been duplicated for walking comfort, he said.

Simpson pointed out that there is a trend to the home with basements, which, of course, require wood joist floors.

Dishwasher at Best When Water Is Hot

If an electric dishwasher is to be installed in the kitchen of a new house, make sure that it will be supplied with water of at least 140 degrees.

One reason electric dishwashers get dishes cleaner than hand washing is that they use powerful jets of extremely hot water.

If no dishwasher is being installed at present, have the basic wiring and plumbing for it put in anyway. It will cost less as part of later.



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
