**Stop Sign Rejected For Woodward-Oak**

There will be no stop sign at the Woodward-Oak intersection other than those now existing both eastbound and westbound Oak St. traffic to stop, Birmingham city commissioners decided Monday night.

It had been proposed that a stop sign be installed to control southbound Woodward traffic at the intersection.

BUT TRAFFIC consultant T. M. Vandertempel and Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley felt the sign was not needed at this time.

Moxley said that instead of making the corner safer, it might create a situation whereby Oak St. traffic would be lulled into a feeling of false security and become involved in an accident that would be caused by a southbound Woodward motorist failing to observe the stop sign.

**2 Banks Tell 1% Increase In Interest**

Two banks which have branches in Birmingham and area have announced increases in interest on savings accounts, effective June 1.

The Detroit Bank and Trust Co. and National Bank of Detroit will increase interest rates from the present 2 per cent to 3 per cent.

Said Raymond T. Perring, president of Detroit Bank & Trust Co.:

"This move is part of our traditional policy of giving our depositors the highest possible return on their savings consistent with the soundest banking practices."

HE SAID present Time Thrift and Savings Certificates accounts in which funds were deposited for a specified period of time will be converted to regular savings pass-book accounts. Withdrawals may then be made at will.

National Bank's increase was announced by Donald F. Valley, chairman and Henry T. Bodman, president.

Special savings accounts, which have been subject to certain restrictions, will become identical with regular savings accounts, they stated.
