

## Young Peoples Studio Offers New Class

Enrollments are being taken now for a new music drama curriculum at the Young Peoples Studio Theatre in the Loon Building, Ann at Brown Streets, Birmingham.

The curriculum will comprise voice production, coaching, choral training, fundamental acting for music students and fundamental music for drama students.

Working with the idea of teaching music through drama, Melvin L. Whittle, director-producer of the Young Peoples Studio Theatre, arranged a meeting of prominent music people to formulate a curriculum which covers the fields of music previously inaccessible to the non-professional student interested in music and drama.

A NEW DEPARTMENT was formed and a curriculum established. The music theater workshop will be directed by musical persons such as Kathleen Murtagh Finck, member of the Abbey Players of Dublin, and who has done dramatic actress in opera, musical comedy, stage, screen and television; Miss Aurelia Tonti Pavia, teacher of music at Wayne State University, and prominent opera and voice coach in this area.

## Warning: Moonshine Dangerous

The bootlegger has been cheating the Federal Government out of millions of dollars a year in lost taxes, and now he may be cheating his customers out of years of living.

Internal Revenue Service recently issued the following warning: the making and selling of moonshine is not only illegal—it is dangerous.

This warning was put out by federal alcohol and tobacco tax investigators who have become alarmed over the finding of poisonous lead content in bootleg whiskey.

INVESTIGATORS SAID they are certain it has been lead and not alcohol that has killed some drinkers of illegal whiskey. Although most of the lead-tainted moonshine has been found

in the South, the problem is not confined to that section, according to W. A. Collawn, Assistant Regional Commissioner of the Chicago Region, which includes Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin.

Collawn said considerable quantities of this illegal liquor have been shipped from the South to States in the North, including the States under his supervision.

INVESTIGATORS SAY they are not only troubled by the illegal liquor shipped from the South but they are also concerned with the illegal liquor distilled here.

The Chicago Region is one of the affected spots in the North and although no serious cases of lead poisoning have been found, it is always a potential danger. Laboratory tests made of illegal

whiskey recently seized in the Chicago Region prove much of it contains an amount of lead highly dangerous, if not deadly.

IT IS BELIEVED that a prime source of lead in moonshine comes from solder used to fasten together pieces of homemade stills. Another source of the metallic poison comes from auto radiators, a favorite makeshift condenser among moonshiners.

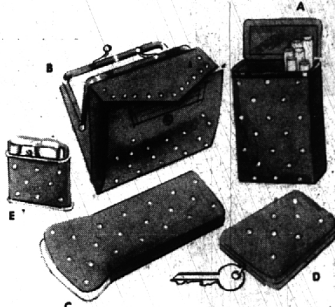
