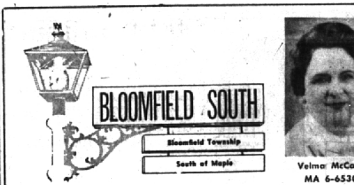


MRS. WILLETT MCCORTNEY JR. man and ushers were John Chapman, Raymond Lammers and Robert Turner.
