of gravel treatment were not compelled to change. Black-topping only occurs upon the desire and investigation of the majority of those living in an area.

The council adopted a \$24,667 operating budget as published and increased road appropriations by \$5000 for a total of \$30,225 to include a safety factor to major roads and provide for contingencies in the moving of a portion of the Carol road entrance which was not included in previously published figures. The change will affect only the reserve balance.

Bids for contract No. 4 of the road and drainage program for 1961 will be opened June 8 and brought before the council June 12.

FRANKLIN COMMUNITY library announced that a board of review will be held May 20 from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the village offices.

Dr. Ralph Smith and Richard Caskey will again serve on the board.

RESIDENTS OF THE Rosemond Hills area heard village president Calvert Thomas read a request from Sterling Garrett for permission to remove sand from the property of Mrs. Piedad Sharr. Opposing the plan to bring the level of her property in line with that of Hester and Northwestern roads, the group seemed relieved when councilman Robert Mitchell cited a section of the zoning ordinance prohibiting the commercial removal of soil. The council may find it necessary to supplement this restriction with a dump and fill ordinance, but no further action was taken Monday night.

The protesting group claim that the proposed soil removal would create a "cliff" 40 feet high at the border of their adjacent properties. Franklin's council will convene again May 22.

Stone to Prepare Report on Roads

LATHERUP — City Administrator Jerald Stone was directed by the council Monday to prepare a five-year projection pertaining to road conditions in the city. Stone will also present a report at next Monday's council meeting relative to the storm and sanitary sewer program.

In a continuation of the May 1 council meeting, the council asked Stone for the road projection in order to determine road needs for the next five years.

THE REPORT on sewers will be made as an outcome of a letter sent by Stone to Engineer Ray

Smit of Ayres, Lewis, Norris and May in which Stone listed nine questions.

Stone's report will be based on Smit's reply to matters pertaining to completion of sanitary and storm sewers, connections with the Evergreen interceptor and storm water drainage facilities. The report will also cover provision for storm water overflow and disconnection of down spouts as well as other information on the sewer program.

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


