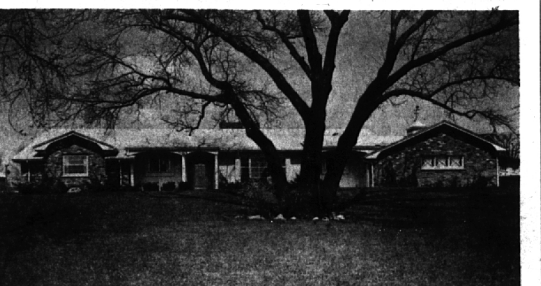

**Toddler Drowns In Area Lake**

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — The two-year-old son of Bloomfield Township residents drowned May 4 in Lower Long Lake.

Douglas Carey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Archibald Carey, Jr., 3518 Franklin Road, failed to respond when his mother administered mouth-to-mouth breathing. A fire department resuscitator crew also were unable to revive the child.

THE BOY was found in two feet of water about five feet from shore by his mother and a neighbor. Mrs. Carey said she was sewing on the front lawn while the boy played with two neighbor children according to police. Investigating his disappearance when it became suddenly quiet, she discovered the boy's body.

Bloomfield Township police were contacted after Carey arrived home from Livonia where he operates an automatic laundry. He was called by his wife.

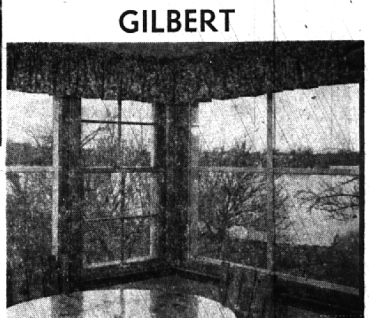
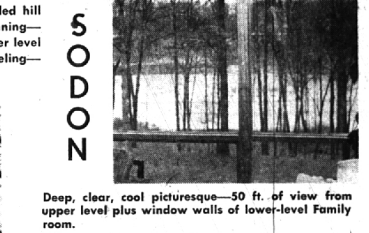
