Flowers for the testable were arranged by Mrs. H. H. Hauser.

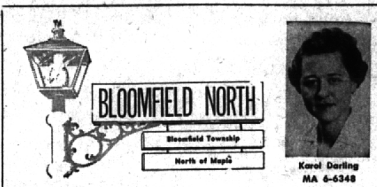

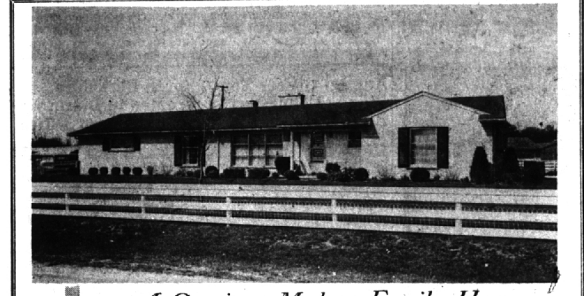

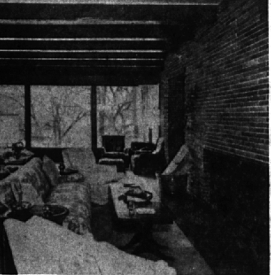
