Mr. and Mrs. Sharp were appointed by the American Baptist Foreign Mission Societies in 1953. They spent a year studying in Belgium and then served first at Banaa Mankete teaching secondary school and then in Leopoldville, where they were in charge of educational work and assisted in Christian center activities.

Mr. and Mrs. Sharp are members of the First Baptist Church of Sedan, Kansas, and receive special support from the Columbia Street Baptist Church, Bangor, Maine; South Baptist Church, Boston, Mass.; and the Baptist Churches in Presque Isle, Maine and Lins, New York.

Youth Up Early To Monitor Radio Signals from Space

A 19-year-old Wesleyan University sophomore from Birmingham is spending the early morning hours monitoring radio signals from Jupiter and other planets.

Peter G. Smith learned in an astronomy class that planets, Jupiter in particular, were emitting static-sounding radio signals and that Wesleyan, in conjunction with Yale University, was setting up a monitoring system to study them.

He volunteered his service to the project, helped set it up and won a National Science Foundation grant for further research.

An amateur radio operator who has conversed with other "ham's" from Siberia to Antarctica, Smith monitors the signals through a special receiver in one of the col-
