Again this year the emphasis will be on swimming. Director "Bernie" Walters, who is on the staff at Pine Lake School, has taught life-saving and coached swimming teams for a period of 17 years.

Walters was the physical director of the Pontiac YMCA for five years. This will be his fifth summer in the recreation program and his third as Pine Lake Summer recreation director.

WILLIAM PATTON, Bloomfield Hills Schools' elementary physical education teacher, and Miss Virginia Dowling, fourth grade teacher at the Conant School, will assist Walters in teaching and administering the program.

Miss Joyce Adams, a sophomore at Michigan State University majoring in elementary education and minoring in art, will be a counselor.

Assistant counselors are Sue Glanville, Barbara Donnelly, Sandy Georgett, Terry Givins, Andy Maros, Jane Mersky and Diana.

THE JUNIOR program will be geared to those children from kindergarten to the third grade. Monday through Friday from 9:30 until noon these youngsters will enjoy in addition to swimming instruction, group games, arts and crafts, physical skills development, nature story telling, "quiet" games and a weekly special events day.

THE SENIOR program (grades 4-8) will have swimming instruction, life-saving, water safety, diving, physical fitness testing program, track and field, group games, tumbling, tennis, archery, basketball, soccer, softball, arts and crafts, copper drumming, moose plus overnight campouts and weekly special events.

THE FIRST period will be from June 10 until July 11. The second period will start July 11 and run through July 28.

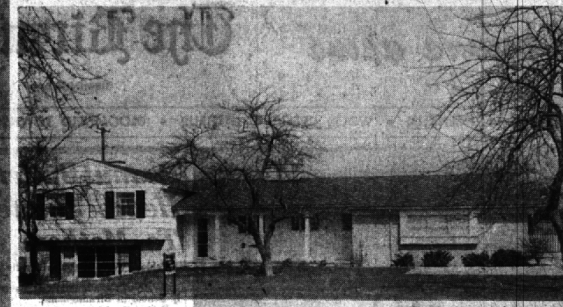
