TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Please Take Notice that the Annual Election in Bloomfield Hills School District No. 2, County of Oakland, Michigan, will be held in said School District on June 12, 1961.

Section (532), Chapter 8, Part II, Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, provides as follows:

"The Inspectors of election at any annual or special election shall not receive the vote of any person residing in a registration school district whose name is not registered as an elector in the city or township in which he resides . . ."

THE LAST DAY on which persons may register with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside in order to be eligible to vote at said annual election to be held June 12, 1961, is Friday, June 2, 1961. Persons registering after 5:00 o'clock P.M., Eastern Standard Time, on said Friday, June 2, 1961, are not eligible to vote at said annual election.

Under the provisions of Act 269, Public Acts of Michigan, 1955, registrations will not be taken by school officials, and only persons who have registered as general electors with the Clerk of the City or Township in which they reside are registered school electors. Persons planning to register with City and Township Clerks must ascertain the days and hours on which the Clerk's office is open for registration.

Tax Commission Approves County Equalization Total

The State Tax Commission has approved Oakland County's recommended 1961 equalization figure of \$2,994,688,200. The figure now awaits a hearing in Lansing on May 22.

With final acceptance, which county equalization officials expect will be forthcoming, the county will be able to levy a tax of 5.39 per \$1,000 of state equalized valuation to meet its 1962 operating budget of \$1,775,941.

This rate would mean a decrease of 23 of a mill less than the 1960 rate of 5.62, and .09 of a mill less than the anticipated 5.48 rate.

AN INCREASE in valuation of \$86 million over the 1960 figure accounts for the reduction, according to officials. Acceptance of the county's recommended valuation, up 1.28 per cent over 1960, is being held up by an appeal to the tax commission by Pleasant Ridge. The city is protesting appraisal methods involving some of its property.

8-Mile Drain Bids Opened For Bond Sale

The final step in the construction of the long-awaited Eight Mile Drain was reached when bids for the purchase of \$3,038,000 in bonds were opened May 2 in the office of Oakland County Drain Commissioner Daniel W. Barry.

The successful bidder was Braumbosworth and Company, Detroit, with net interest cost of 3.82 per cent.

Other bidders were Halsey, Stuart and Company with a net interest cost of 3.92 per cent and P. S. Withers and Company with a net interest cost of 3.94 per cent.

THE 19,000-foot drain along Eight Mile Road from east of Greenfield to the Rouge River is designed to relieve flooding of Northwestern between Eight Mile and Nine Mile roads as well as provide a storm drain outlet for the southwestern section of Oak Park, Northland Shopping Center and the south area of Southfield.

Barry said that Detroit will help pay for the drain because the storm water will be kept from the Detroit sewage storm system. Sharing in the special assessment to pay off the bond issue will be Southfield City, Michigan State and Highway Department, Oak Park and Oakland County.

Contractors, S. A. Healy & Garzaro of Detroit have been awarded the construction contract and work is expected to begin after July 1, according to Barry.

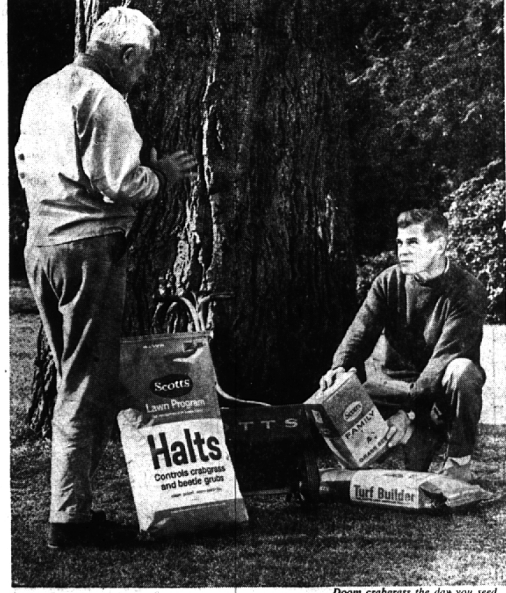
