

Visitors Can View Train Memorial Saturday at Durand

One of the biggest celebrations in recent Durand history will occur when the Durand Railroad Club will start of Michigan Week by dedicating its steam locomotive memorial to the Durand area. The Grand Trunk Western's Engine 5623, a 4-6-2 type machine built in 1929, by Baldwin Locomotive Works, is the centerpiece of the memorial. It will be on display at the Durand station from 10 a. m. to 5 p. m. Saturday.

Steam locomotive facilities maintained by the railroad are Durand. A major role in the area's economy until the recent displacement of steam power by the new diesels.

"Railroad Day" is expected to attract several thousand people. A special steam-powered train will bring hundreds of riders from Detroit, Royal Oak, Birmingham and Pontiac.

At 1:30 p. m. a parade consisting of several area bands, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion and military drill teams, Boy and Girl Scout units and floats will proceed to the dedication site on Clinton Street.

Service clubs and other organizations will sell food to visitors in order to raise funds for maintenance of the memorial. Local merchants are planning special sales the day.

The special train from Detroit will be sponsored by the Michigan Railroad Club. The public is invited to use it for transportation to and from the dedication ceremonies.

POWERED BY GTW's last active steam locomotive, 4-6-2 No. 5623, the train will leave Brush Street Station at 9:15 a. m., Royal Oak at 9:45 a. m., Birmingham at 9:55 a. m. and Pontiac at 10:15 a. m.

Arrival in Durand will be at 11:30 a. m. The train will return from Durand at 4:15 p. m., arriving in Pontiac at 5:15 p. m., Royal Oak at 5:30 p. m., Birmingham at 5:45 p. m. and Brush Street Station at 6:15 p. m.
