Bendix Research Labs Hold 2-Day Symposium

Playing a major role in promoting the state's scientific climate during the celebration of Michigan Week (May 21-27), the Research Laboratories Division of the Bendix Corp. will hold a two-day symposium on "Information Processing and Computer Technology" May 22-23.

Thirty of the nation's leading computer scientists will convene to exchange information on the most recent advances and possible future developments in the rapidly expanding field of electronic computers.

"This is another in a continuing series of efforts by the Research Laboratories Division to advance the state of the art in various fields of technology," said Dr. V. E. Kock, director and general manager, who is arranging the conference.

DR. E. R. PORE, vice president of research, International Business Machines Corp. and a member of the President's Science Advisory Committee, will deliver the pre-symposium address at a dinner to be held the evening before at Oakland-Tribune Country Club in Bloomfield Hills.
