Book to Tell Newberg Side

William C. Newberg's controversy with Chrysler Corp. will serve as the basis for a book entitled "My Sixty Days as President of Chrysler."

Publishing rights to the story have been acquired by G. P. Putnam's Sons of New York.

The book will be written by Newberg, 1411 Kirkway, Bloomfield Hills, and Phil A. Koury, author of the recent best seller, "Yes, Mr. DeMille." Publication is expected in August 1962 or earlier.

THE 49-YEAR-OLD Newberg climbed to the presidency after 27 years with the company. He resigned last June after only 90 days as president on charges that his interest in two supplier firms conflicted with his position at Chrysler.

Newberg's petition alleges that "L. C. Colbert (of Bloomfield Hills) conspired to destroy Newberg professionally and thereby eliminate him as a threat to Colbert's continuation as Chrysler's chief executive."

Colbert is Chrysler's president and board chairman. Prominent Chrysler directors are named in the petition as "co-conspirators."

Several stockholder suits against Chrysler and congressional attention followed the Newberg action.

Newberg, a graduate engineer from the University of Washington, is now a consultant for Detroit Broach and Machine Co. of Rochester.
